

Old Testament

Psa 105:1 Oh give thanks to the LORD; call upon his name; make known his deeds among the peoples!

Psa 105:2 Sing to him, sing praises to him; tell of all his wondrous works!

Psa 105:3 Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice!

Psa 105:4 Seek the LORD and his strength; seek his presence continually!

Psa 105:5 Remember the wondrous works that he has done, his miracles, and the judgments he uttered,

Psa 105:6 O offspring of Abraham, his servant, children of Jacob, his chosen ones!

Psa 105:7 He is the LORD our God; his judgments are in all the earth.

Psa 105:8 He remembers his covenant forever, the word that he commanded, for a thousand generations,

Psa 105:9 the covenant that he made with Abraham, his sworn promise to Isaac,

Psa 105:10 which he confirmed to Jacob as a statute, to Israel as an everlasting covenant,

Psa 105:11 saying, "To you I will give the land of Canaan as your portion for an inheritance."

Psa 105:12 When they were few in number, of little account, and sojourners in it,

Psa 105:13 wandering from nation to nation, from one kingdom to another people,

Psa 105:14 he allowed no one to oppress them; he rebuked kings on their account,

Psa 105:15 saying, "Touch not my anointed ones, do my prophets no harm!"

Psa 105:16 When he summoned a famine on the land and broke all supply of bread,

Psa 105:17 he had sent a man ahead of them, Joseph, who was sold as a slave.

Psa 105:18 His feet were hurt with fetters; his neck was put in a collar of iron;

Psa 105:19 until what he had said came to pass, the word of the LORD tested him.

Psa 105:20 The king sent and released him; the ruler of the peoples set him free;

Psa 105:21 he made him lord of his house and ruler of all his possessions,

Psa 105:22 to bind his princes at his pleasure and to teach his elders wisdom.

Psa 105:23 Then Israel came to Egypt; Jacob sojourned in the land of Ham.

Psa 105:24 And the LORD made his people very fruitful and made them stronger than their foes.

Psa 105:25 He turned their hearts to hate his people, to deal craftily with his servants.

Psa 105:26 He sent Moses, his servant, and Aaron, whom he had chosen.

Psa 105:27 They performed his signs among them and miracles in the land of Ham.

Psa 105:28 He sent darkness, and made the land dark; they did not rebel against his words.

Psa 105:29 He turned their waters into blood and caused their fish to die.

Psa 105:30 Their land swarmed with frogs, even in the chambers of their kings.

Psa 105:31 He spoke, and there came swarms of flies, and gnats throughout their country.

Psa 105:32 He gave them hail for rain, and fiery lightning bolts through their land.

Psa 105:33 He struck down their vines and fig trees, and shattered the trees of their country.

Psa 105:34 He spoke, and the locusts came, young locusts without number,

Psa 105:35 which devoured all the vegetation in their land and ate up the fruit of their ground.

Psa 105:36 He struck down all the firstborn in their land, the firstfruits of all their strength.

Psa 105:37 Then he brought out Israel with silver and gold, and there was none among his tribes who stumbled.

Psa 105:38 Egypt was glad when they departed, for dread of them had fallen upon it.

Psa 105:39 He spread a cloud for a covering, and fire to give light by night.

Psa 105:40 They asked, and he brought quail, and gave them bread from heaven in abundance.

Psa 105:41 He opened the rock, and water gushed out; it flowed through the desert like a river.

Psa 105:42 For he remembered his holy promise, and Abraham, his servant.
Psa 105:43 So he brought his people out with joy, his chosen ones with singing.
Psa 105:44 And he gave them the lands of the nations, and they took possession of the fruit of the peoples' toil,
Psa 105:45 that they might keep his statutes and observe his laws. Praise the LORD!

Psa 106:1 Praise the LORD! Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever!

Psa 106:2 Who can utter the mighty deeds of the LORD, or declare all his praise?

Psa 106:3 Blessed are they who observe justice, who do righteousness at all times!

Psa 106:4 Remember me, O LORD, when you show favor to your people; help me when you save them,

Psa 106:5 that I may look upon the prosperity of your chosen ones, that I may rejoice in the gladness of your nation, that I may glory with your inheritance.

Psa 106:6 Both we and our fathers have sinned; we have committed iniquity; we have done wickedness.

Psa 106:7 Our fathers, when they were in Egypt, did not consider your wondrous works; they did not remember the abundance of your steadfast love, but rebelled by the sea, at the Red Sea.

Psa 106:8 Yet he saved them for his name's sake, that he might make known his mighty power.

Psa 106:9 He rebuked the Red Sea, and it became dry, and he led them through the deep as through a desert.

Psa 106:10 So he saved them from the hand of the foe and redeemed them from the power of the enemy.

Psa 106:11 And the waters covered their adversaries; not one of them was left.

Psa 106:12 Then they believed his words; they sang his praise.

Psa 106:13 But they soon forgot his works; they did not wait for his counsel.

Psa 106:14 But they had a wanton craving in the wilderness, and put God to the test in the desert;

Psa 106:15 he gave them what they asked, but sent a wasting disease among them.

Psa 106:16 When men in the camp were jealous of Moses and Aaron, the holy one of the LORD,

Psa 106:17 the earth opened and swallowed up Dathan, and covered the company of Abiram.

Psa 106:18 Fire also broke out in their company; the flame burned up the wicked.

Psa 106:19 They made a calf in Horeb and worshiped a metal image.

Psa 106:20 They exchanged the glory of God for the image of an ox that eats grass.

Psa 106:21 They forgot God, their Savior, who had done great things in Egypt,

Psa 106:22 wondrous works in the land of Ham, and awesome deeds by the Red Sea.

Psa 106:23 Therefore he said he would destroy them-- had not Moses, his chosen one, stood in the breach before him, to turn away his wrath from destroying them.

Psa 106:24 Then they despised the pleasant land, having no faith in his promise.

Psa 106:25 They murmured in their tents, and did not obey the voice of the LORD.

Psa 106:26 Therefore he raised his hand and swore to them that he would make them fall in the wilderness,

Psa 106:27 and would make their offspring fall among the nations, scattering them among the lands.

Psa 106:28 Then they yoked themselves to the Baal of Peor, and ate sacrifices offered to the dead;

Psa 106:29 they provoked the LORD to anger with their deeds, and a plague broke out among them.

Psa 106:30 Then Phinehas stood up and intervened, and the plague was stayed.

Psa 106:31 And that was counted to him as righteousness from generation to generation forever.

Psa 106:32 They angered him at the waters of Meribah, and it went ill with Moses on their account,

Psa 106:33 for they made his spirit bitter, and he spoke rashly with his lips.

Psa 106:34 They did not destroy the peoples, as the LORD commanded them,

Psa 106:35 but they mixed with the nations and learned to do as they did.

Psa 106:36 They served their idols, which became a snare to them.

Psa 106:37 They sacrificed their sons and their daughters to the demons;

Psa 106:38 they poured out innocent blood, the blood of their sons and daughters, whom they sacrificed to the idols of Canaan, and the land was polluted with blood.

Psa 106:39 Thus they became unclean by their acts, and played the whore in their deeds.

Psa 106:40 Then the anger of the LORD was kindled against his people, and he abhorred his heritage;

Psa 106:41 he gave them into the hand of the nations, so that those who hated them ruled over them.

Psa 106:42 Their enemies oppressed them, and they were brought into subjection under their power.

Psa 106:43 Many times he delivered them, but they were rebellious in their purposes and were brought low through their iniquity.

Psa 106:44 Nevertheless, he looked upon their distress, when he heard their cry.

Psa 106:45 For their sake he remembered his covenant, and relented according to the abundance of his steadfast love.

Psa 106:46 He caused them to be pitied by all those who held them captive.

Psa 106:47 Save us, O LORD our God, and gather us from among the nations, that we may give thanks to your holy name and glory in your praise.

Psa 106:48 Blessed be the LORD, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting! And let all the people say, "Amen!" Praise the LORD!

New Testament

Rom 15:1 We who are strong have an obligation to bear with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves.

Rom 15:2 Let each of us please his neighbor for his good, to build him up.

Rom 15:3 For Christ did not please himself, but as it is written, "The reproaches of those who reproached you fell on me."

Rom 15:4 For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.

Rom 15:5 May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus,

Rom 15:6 that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Rom 15:7 Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.

Rom 15:8 For I tell you that Christ became a servant to the circumcised to show God's truthfulness, in order to confirm the promises given to the patriarchs,

Rom 15:9 and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written, "Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles, and sing to your name."

Rom 15:10 And again it is said, "Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people."

Rom 15:11 And again, "Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and let all the peoples extol him."

Rom 15:12 And again Isaiah says, "The root of Jesse will come, even he who arises to rule the Gentiles; in him will the Gentiles hope."

Rom 15:13 May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope.

Rom 15:14 I myself am satisfied about you, my brothers, that you yourselves are full of goodness, filled with all knowledge and able to instruct one another.

Rom 15:15 But on some points I have written to you very boldly by way of reminder, because of the grace given me by God

Rom 15:16 to be a minister of Christ Jesus to the Gentiles in the priestly service of the gospel of God, so that the offering of the Gentiles may be acceptable, sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

Rom 15:17 In Christ Jesus, then, I have reason to be proud of my work for God.

Rom 15:18 For I will not venture to speak of anything except what Christ has accomplished through me to bring the Gentiles to obedience--by word and deed,

Rom 15:19 by the power of signs and wonders, by the power of the Spirit of God--so that from Jerusalem and all the way around to Illyricum I have fulfilled the ministry of the gospel of Christ;

Rom 15:20 and thus I make it my ambition to preach the gospel, not where Christ has already been named, lest I build on someone else's foundation,

Rom 15:21 but as it is written, "Those who have never been told of him will see, and those who have never heard will understand."
