

Old Testament

Psa 109:1 To the choirmaster. A Psalm of David. Be not silent, O God of my praise!

Psa 109:2 For wicked and deceitful mouths are opened against me, speaking against me with lying tongues.

Psa 109:3 They encircle me with words of hate, and attack me without cause.

Psa 109:4 In return for my love they accuse me, but I give myself to prayer.

Psa 109:5 So they reward me evil for good, and hatred for my love.

Psa 109:6 Appoint a wicked man against him; let an accuser stand at his right hand.

Psa 109:7 When he is tried, let him come forth guilty; let his prayer be counted as sin!

Psa 109:8 May his days be few; may another take his office!

Psa 109:9 May his children be fatherless and his wife a widow!

Psa 109:10 May his children wander about and beg, seeking food far from the ruins they inhabit!

Psa 109:11 May the creditor seize all that he has; may strangers plunder the fruits of his toil!

Psa 109:12 Let there be none to extend kindness to him, nor any to pity his fatherless children!

Psa 109:13 May his posterity be cut off; may his name be blotted out in the second generation!

Psa 109:14 May the iniquity of his fathers be remembered before the LORD, and let not the sin of his mother be blotted out!

Psa 109:15 Let them be before the LORD continually, that he may cut off the memory of them from the earth!

Psa 109:16 For he did not remember to show kindness, but pursued the poor and needy and the brokenhearted, to put them to death.

Psa 109:17 He loved to curse; let curses come upon him! He did not delight in blessing; may it be far from him!

Psa 109:18 He clothed himself with cursing as his coat; may it soak into his body like water, like oil into his bones!

Psa 109:19 May it be like a garment that he wraps around him, like a belt that he puts on every day!

Psa 109:20 May this be the reward of my accusers from the LORD, of those who speak evil against my life!

Psa 109:21 But you, O GOD my Lord, deal on my behalf for your name's sake; because your steadfast love is good, deliver me!

Psa 109:22 For I am poor and needy, and my heart is stricken within me.

Psa 109:23 I am gone like a shadow at evening; I am shaken off like a locust.

Psa 109:24 My knees are weak through fasting; my body has become gaunt, with no fat.

Psa 109:25 I am an object of scorn to my accusers; when they see me, they wag their heads.

Psa 109:26 Help me, O LORD my God! Save me according to your steadfast love!

Psa 109:27 Let them know that this is your hand; you, O LORD, have done it!

Psa 109:28 Let them curse, but you will bless! They arise and are put to shame, but your servant will be glad!

Psa 109:29 May my accusers be clothed with dishonor; may they be wrapped in their own shame as in a cloak!

Psa 109:30 With my mouth I will give great thanks to the LORD; I will praise him in the midst of the throng.

Psa 109:31 For he stands at the right hand of the needy one, to save him from those who condemn his soul to death.

Psa 110:1 A Psalm of David. The LORD says to my Lord: "Sit at my right hand, until I make your enemies your footstool."

Psa 110:2 The LORD sends forth from Zion your mighty scepter. Rule in the midst of your enemies!

Psa 110:3 Your people will offer themselves freely on the day of your power, in holy garments; from the womb of the morning, the dew of your youth will be yours.

Psa 110:4 The LORD has sworn and will not change his mind, "You are a priest forever after the order of Melchizedek."

Psa 110:5 The Lord is at your right hand; he will shatter kings on the day of his wrath.

Psa 110:6 He will execute judgment among the nations, filling them with corpses; he will shatter chiefs over the wide earth.

Psa 110:7 He will drink from the brook by the way; therefore he will lift up his head.

Psa 111:1 Praise the LORD! I will give thanks to the LORD with my whole heart, in the company of the upright, in the congregation.

Psa 111:2 Great are the works of the LORD, studied by all who delight in them.

Psa 111:3 Full of splendor and majesty is his work, and his righteousness endures forever.

Psa 111:4 He has caused his wondrous works to be remembered; the LORD is gracious and merciful.

Psa 111:5 He provides food for those who fear him; he remembers his covenant forever.

Psa 111:6 He has shown his people the power of his works, in giving them the inheritance of the nations.

Psa 111:7 The works of his hands are faithful and just; all his precepts are trustworthy;

Psa 111:8 they are established forever and ever, to be performed with faithfulness and uprightness.

Psa 111:9 He sent redemption to his people; he has commanded his covenant forever. Holy and awesome is his name!

Psa 111:10 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; all those who practice it have a good understanding. His praise endures forever!

New Testament

Rom 16:1 I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a servant of the church at Cenchreae,

Rom 16:2 that you may welcome her in the Lord in a way worthy of the saints, and help her in whatever she may need from you, for she has been a patron of many and of myself as well.

Rom 16:3 Greet Prisca and Aquila, my fellow workers in Christ Jesus,

Rom 16:4 who risked their necks for my life, to whom not only I give thanks but all the churches of the Gentiles give thanks as well.

Rom 16:5 Greet also the church in their house. Greet my beloved Epaenetus, who was the first convert to Christ in Asia.

Rom 16:6 Greet Mary, who has worked hard for you.

Rom 16:7 Greet Andronicus and Junia, my kinsmen and my fellow prisoners. They are well known to the apostles, and they were in Christ before me.

Rom 16:8 Greet Ampliatus, my beloved in the Lord.

Rom 16:9 Greet Urbanus, our fellow worker in Christ, and my beloved Stachys.

Rom 16:10 Greet Apelles, who is approved in Christ. Greet those who belong to the family of Aristobulus.

Rom 16:11 Greet my kinsman Herodion. Greet those in the Lord who belong to the family of Narcissus.

Rom 16:12 Greet those workers in the Lord, Tryphaena and Tryphosa. Greet the beloved Persis, who has worked hard in the Lord.

Rom 16:13 Greet Rufus, chosen in the Lord; also his mother, who has been a mother to me as well.

Rom 16:14 Greet Asyncritus, Phlegon, Hermes, Patrobas, Hermas, and the brothers who are with them.

Rom 16:15 Greet Philologus, Julia, Nereus and his sister, and Olympas, and all the saints who are with them.

Rom 16:16 Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the churches of Christ greet you.

Rom 16:17 I appeal to you, brothers, to watch out for those who cause divisions and create obstacles contrary to the doctrine that you have been taught; avoid them.

Rom 16:18 For such persons do not serve our Lord Christ, but their own appetites, and by smooth talk and flattery they deceive the hearts of the naive.

Rom 16:19 For your obedience is known to all, so that I rejoice over you, but I want you to be wise as to what is good and innocent as to what is evil.

Rom 16:20 The God of peace will soon crush Satan under your feet. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

Rom 16:21 Timothy, my fellow worker, greets you; so do Lucius and Jason and Sosipater, my kinsmen.

Rom 16:22 I Tertius, who wrote this letter, greet you in the Lord.

Rom 16:23 Gaius, who is host to me and to the whole church, greets you. Erastus, the city treasurer, and our brother Quartus, greet you.

Rom 16:24 [*The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen.*]

Rom 16:25 Now to him who is able to strengthen you according to my gospel and the preaching of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery that was kept secret for long ages

Rom 16:26 but has now been disclosed and through the prophetic writings has been made known to all nations, according to the command of the eternal God, to bring about the obedience of faith--

Rom 16:27 to the only wise God be glory forevermore through Jesus Christ! Amen.
